Dump truck tyre blow-out

A contractor's dump truck was exiting the pit with the last load of material for the day. A light vehicle (LV) with two occupants was following the dump truck at the recommended 30m distance behind the truck.

The occupants of the LV noticed a cut around the inner-right rear tyre on the truck. As the truck turned left at the switchback, it went over a rock, causing the damaged tyre to blow-out.

The force of the blow-out blew rocks towards the LV, which was turning right at the time, shattering the front passenger window. The passenger sustained a bruise to the left arm and a minor cut to the neck from the window glass.

> MinEx statistics on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the past 5 years show 5% of incidents (267 incidents) involve pressure release, of which 75 involved releases are of explosive pressure.



You need to ensure that:

- Contractors follow maintenance and prestart protocols at your site or if relying on their HSMS, that you have verified their fitness for work checks and maintenance practices.
- Adequate separation is maintained between heavy and light vehicles, particularly on haul roads.
- Regular workplace inspections ensure haul roads are maintained to reduce tyre wear and damage.
