Let's work together to keep ourselves and our workers safe.

Ensure you follow procedures!

Recent data shows a continual increase in the number of incidents resulting from failure of workers to follow procedures.

These incidents typically result from organisations' failure to:

- Involve workers in development of procedures
- Provide adequate training
- Ensure procedures reflect how the job is done
- Keep procedures up-to-date
- Provide adequate supervision
- Address production pressures
- Manage fatigue and other human factors

Workers don't breach procedures to hurt themselves or others!

Safety Silly

Not Following Safety Rules and Procedures can harm more lives than just yours.

MinEx data on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the past 5 years show 15% (816 incidents) of all incidents result from breach of a procedure.

You need to ensure:

- 1. You review the relevance and adequacy of procedures, how they are communicated, that they are up-to-date.
- 2. Adequate direct supervision is always provided.
