Worker injured cutting steel

A worker was cutting steel when the clamp holding the steel released unexpectedly.

A piece of steel jumped uncontrollably and struck the worker in the face causing a laceration to his nose.

The worker was not wearing any face protection while cutting the steel.

MinEx statistics on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the past 5 years show 14% of incidents (874 incidents) result in an occupational injury.



You need to ensure that:

- 1. All plant is fundamentally stable before commencing maintenance work. Clamps should be checked before cutting begins.
- 2. Appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is always worn when carrying out tasks that require it to be worn.
- Regular workplace inspections are conducted to identify unsafe activities and ensure work is conducted safely and in accordance with safe operating procedures.
